	envelope.
3.	(Voter) Seal this envelope and return it to the Clerk.
4.	(Clerk) Record the Vote Site # or Name AND Date//20
5.	(Clerk) Record Ballot Style (Located on Voter's signed Voter Pass)
6.	(Clerk) Verify number of attempts with prior spoiled ballot envelopes, if necessary to confirm.
7.	(Clerk) Check # of VOTING attempts:

## **Important Instructions for Clerk and Voter**

Under Florida State Statute 101.5608, in no case shall a voter be furnished more than (3) ballots including the original 1<sup>st</sup> attempt ballot issued to the voter.

Under Florida State Statute 104.23, any precinct election official who willfully discloses how any elector voted, except upon trial in court, is guilty of a felony of the third degree. Rule 1S-2.034 F.A.C., DS-DE 11.

This envelope will not be opened after being sealed by you, the voter.

This envelope shall be destroyed after the required retention period without opening unless ordered to do so for a court case.

This envelope is provided to ensure the secrecy of your vote in the event you have spoiled your ballot.

The Ballot Stub Number information is required for ballot reconciliation purposes only.
